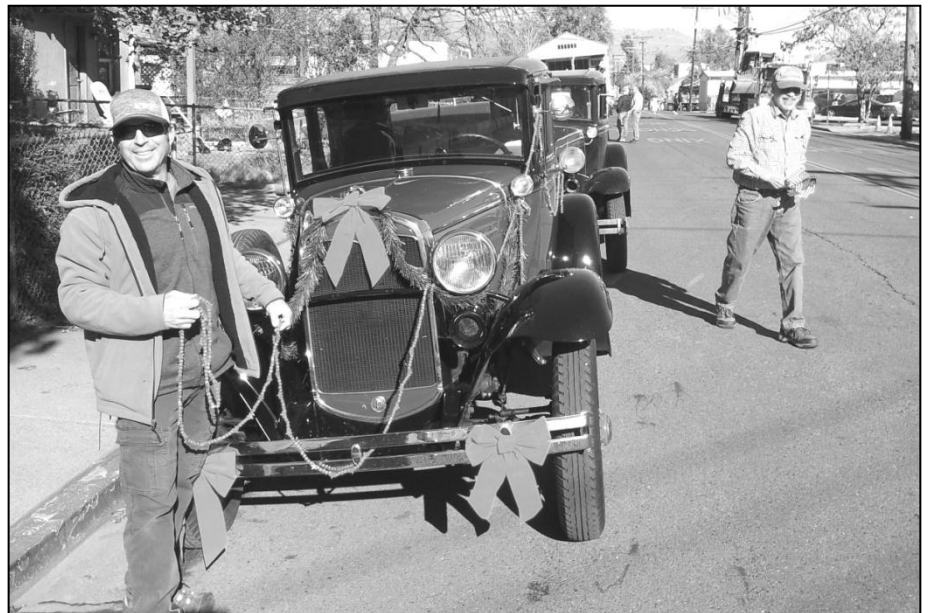

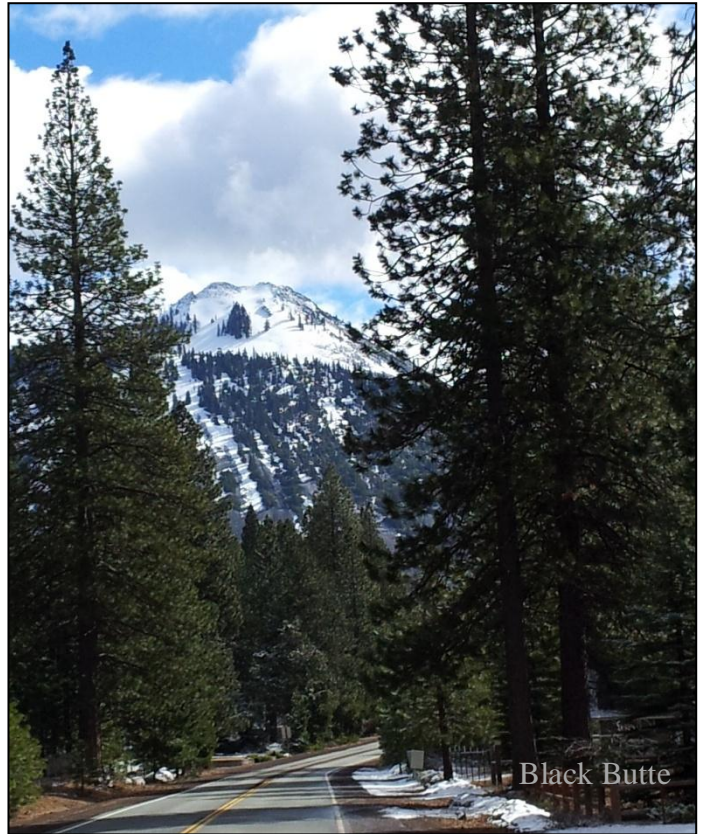

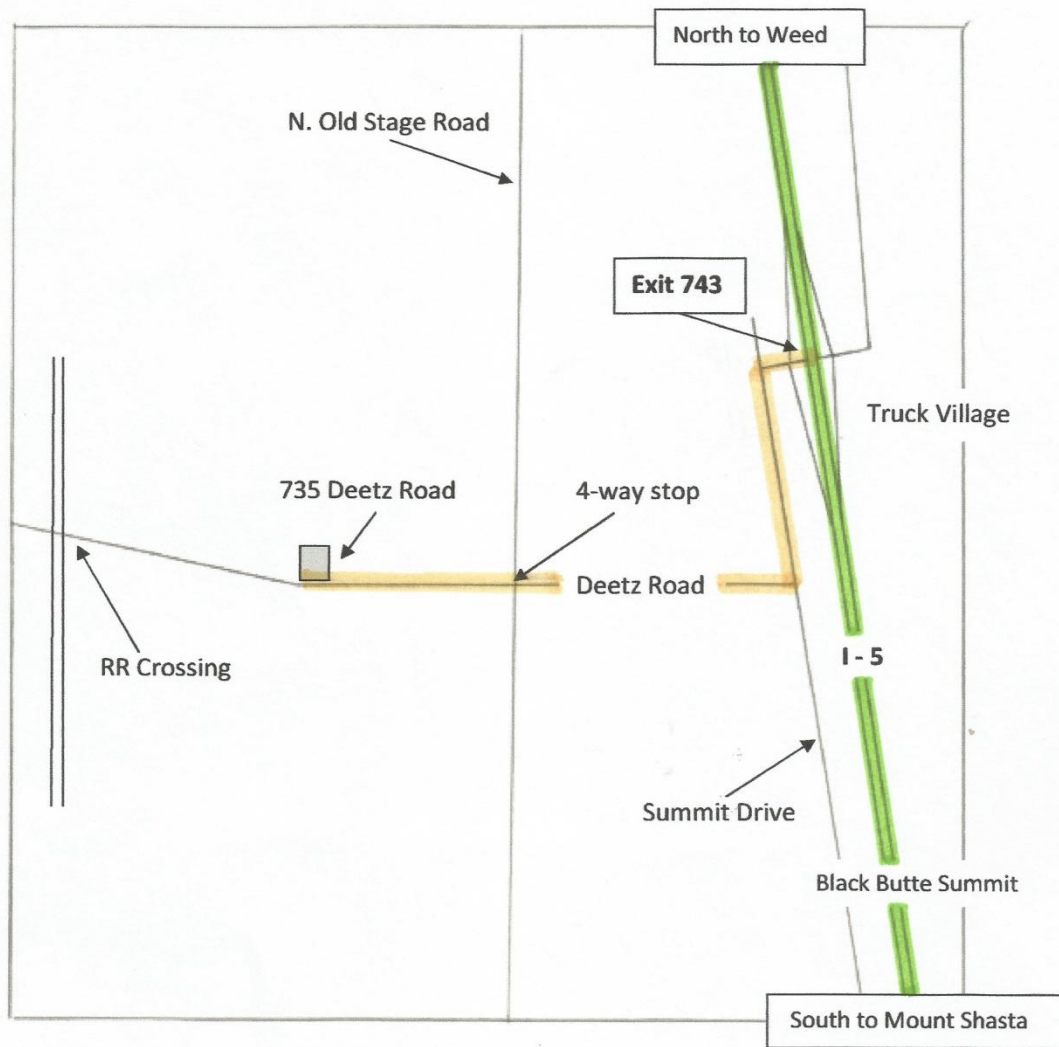

Old Business: There was no old business to report.

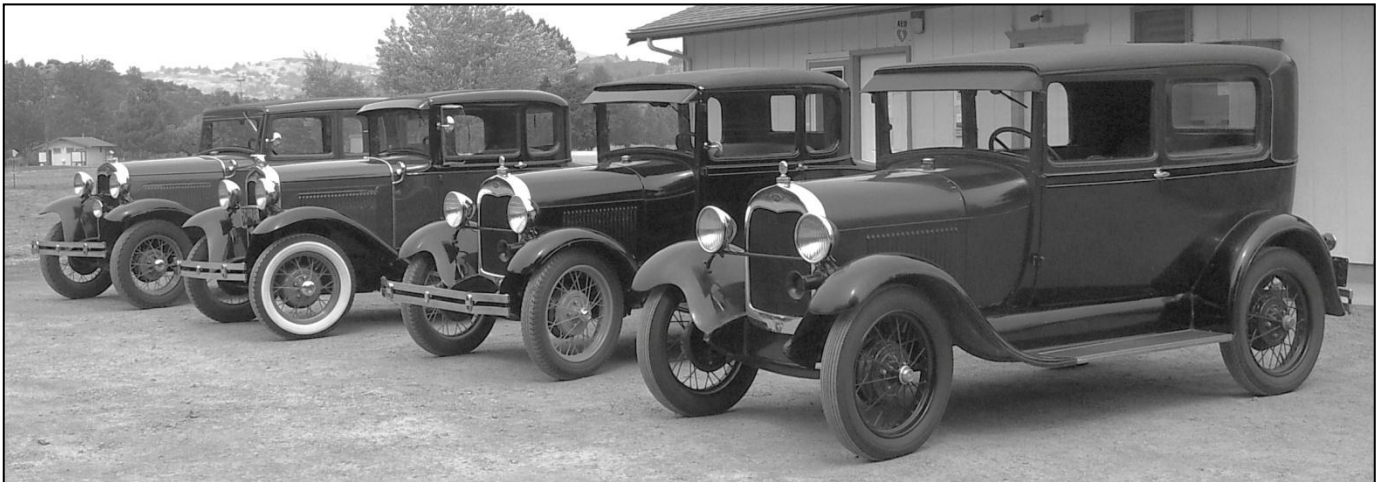
New Business: The date (Saturday, November 26) for the Yreka Holiday Parade was announced. Registration forms are available at the Elks Lodge and at Zephyr Books.
