

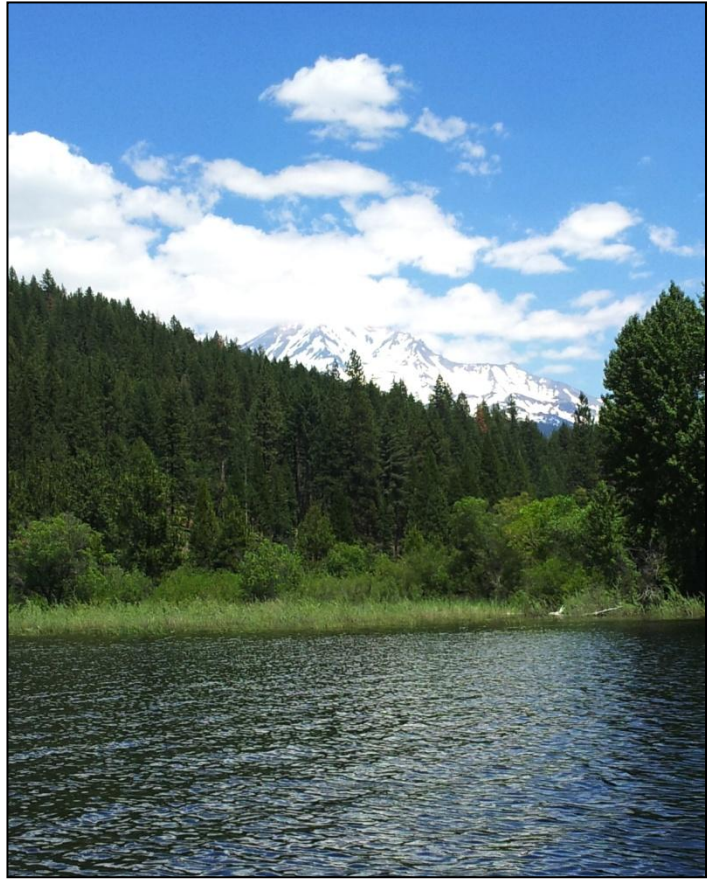
that still happens. I hope so. Free and independent kids likely become free and independent adults. The Fourth of July is a good reminder of that, perhaps.
